Major Transport Hubs



Redlands Coast is served by rail, road and ferries, with major bus hubs at Capalaba and Victoria Point.

Water transport to North Stradbroke Island departs Toondah Harbour, Cleveland; to Coochiemudlo Island departs Victoria Point; to Macleay, Lamb, Russell and Karragarra islands departs Redland Bay. Train stations are located at Cleveland, Ormiston, Wellington Point, Birkdale and Thorneside.

Redlands Coast is located just 26km from Brisbane City. Choose from a variety of public transport options or even take your time driving our beautiful scenic routes through our coastal and hinterland villages.



Bus - Transdev operates regular bus services between Brisbane Transit Centre and Redlands Coast, and also between local villages.



Taxi - Taxis are available on the mainland and some islands.



Train - Trains to Cleveland, with stations along the way, run frequently from Brisbane.



Air - Redlands Coast has easy access to the Brisbane and Gold Coast airports.



Ferry - Passenger and vehicle ferries regularly depart Toondah Harbour, Cleveland for North Stradbroke Island; Victoria Point for Coochiemudlo Island; and Redland Bay Marina for the southern islands.


Aboriginal Culture

Standing on the shores of Minjerribah (North Stradbroke Island) you can feel the spirit of Quandamooka Country flow around you when you close your eyes.

Traditional owners of much of Redlands Coast, the Nughie, Noonuccal and Gorenpul Peoples (collectively known as the Quandamooka People) have lived in harmony with our region's natural wonders for more than 21,000 years.

The Quandamooka People's Dreaming stories and songs honour Country and all its many gifts. If you know where to look, the evidence of this ageless connection surrounds you. A special experience on Redlands Coast is a tour by a Quandamooka guide.

Gain fascinating insights into the oldest surviving culture in the world while tasting regional bush tucker, taking an art class or enjoying a guided kayak trip.



Local tip

The traditional language of Quandamooka People is Jandai. Yura in Jandai means welcome.

Adventure Awaits

Sea kayak, camping and Quandamooka cultural immersion adventure packages can be booked with Redlands Kayak Tours working in partnership with Quandamooka Coast.

Natural Wonders

Redlands Coast is the gateway to Southern Moreton Bay, the beautiful North Stradbroke Island (Minjerrabah), the southern islands and so much more. This is a destination that will open your eyes to a world of wonder right on Brisbane's doorstep.

Our top seven natural wonders are each guaranteed to offer a unique experience.



Marine Park

Redlands Coast nestles along Moreton Bay Marine Park – a beautiful tapestry of islands, reefs, mangroves, seagrass beds, saltmarshes, rocky reefs, inlets and ocean. Home to six of the world's seven sea turtle species, three species of dolphin and the gentle and shy dugong. On Redlands Coast significant populations of dugongs and sea turtles are found close to a major city.

Explore this aquatic playground, visit our islands, enjoy sailing and cruising, snorkelling and diving, kayaking, canoeing and stand up paddle boarding, fishing, whale watching and much more.



Gorge Walk

North Stradbroke Island's impressive Gorge Walk is an absolute must do! The 12 kilometre boardwalk follows the headland of Point Lookout, offering views that are simply breathtaking. The clear waters make it easy to spot marine life, including turtles, dolphins and manta rays – a treat in itself. North Gorge is also the best vantage point on the island to see the migrating humpback whales that pass annually from May to November.

The Gorge Walk is a North Stradbroke Island delight that reveals just how pristine and unspoiled this magnificent island truly is.

Minjerribah Beaches

North Stradbroke Island (Minjerribah) has some of the best beaches in Australia. Surfers love Main Beach and Cylinder Beach, with the latter voted Queensland's best beach in 2017 and 2018. Discover hidden rock pools at Deadmans and Frenchmans beaches.



Coochiemudlo Island

(Goochie mudlo)

Explorer Matthew Flinders landed here in 1799. A short passenger or vehicle ferry ride from Victoria Point, Coochiemudlo boasts natural areas and wildlife, protected waters and shallow beaches. Cast a line, stroll through wetlands or hire a barbecue boat or tinnie. This is a relaxed family friendly destination.



Brown Lake (Bummeira)

Brown Lake, on North Stradbroke Island, takes its name from the tannin in leaves of the surrounding paperbarks and tea trees. It has a fascinating cultural history that spans generations, and is a favourite among visitors looking for the perfect place to swim, picnic, soak up spectacular scenery, or kick back and relax.



Peel Island (Teerk Roo Ra)

With a short trip by boat from the mainland, you will find the crystal clear waters, sandy beaches, and beach camping sites of picturesque Peel Island. Beckoning with naturally wonderful beauty, this island paradise also offers swimming, snorkelling and some of the best local fishing.



King Island (Erobin)

King Island, at Wellington Point, draws visitors from far and wide. Watch for the sandbar that emerges from the waters at low tide, creating a natural bridge from the mainland to your very own island! Be sure to return before the tide comes in.



Coastal Adventures

Be transported to worlds of fun and relaxation. Experience the natural wonders of islands, see whales breaching on their yearly migrations, go surfing and swimming on some of the best beaches anywhere, and dive or snorkel on magnificent, near-shore reefs. Go fishing, explore vast, natural waterways, circumnavigate an island by kayak, discover abundant marine life and stunning vistas, and enjoy the ever flowing coastal breezes.

Kayaking

Take a guided kayak tour you will remember. Explore creeks, mangroves, islands with sandy beaches and out into more open waters. Enjoy informed commentary from your guide and the abundance of bird and marine life on your paddle journey of discovery. Redlands Kayak Tours is the only provider in the region

to offer overnight sea kayaking trips, island circumnavigation, sunrise/full moon and lighthouse tours, creek paddles and kayak adventures for all ages and abilities.

Fishing

The southern islands and North Stradbroke Island, which is the place to be for offshore and beach anglers, also offer an array of fishing experiences. Something Deeper


There are few places in the world where you can swim with majestic manta rays – and Point Lookout on North Stradbroke Island is one of them. From October to April, these gentle giants congregate at Manta Ray Bommie in what is one of Australia's greatest dive experiences. The area's dive sites teem with marine life, including grey nurse sharks, turtles, dolphins and myriad fish species. A new artificial reef is already finding favour with the local sea life and divers keen to add it to their bucket list. You may even encounter a humpback whale during their annual winter migration. Book your next full package dive and accommodation and underwater adventure with Manta Lodge & Scuba Centre.


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Tracks & Trails

A naturally wonderful world of exploration awaits visitors to Redlands Coast's network of world class mountain biking, bushwalking and horse riding tracks and trails. Enjoy heritage trails, track parks and 485km of walking and cycle ways that span Quandamooka Country.

Visit Redlands Track Park for 25km of bushwalking and mountain bike trails, along with walking tracks and equestrian trails through 239ha of natural bushland full of hidden treasures, such as a WWI and WWII heritage site and wildlife encounters. The park can be accessed from the villages of Cleveland, Alexandra Hills and Thornlands.

Bayview Conservation Area, between Redland Bay and Mount Cotton, boasts about 60km of bushwalking and mountain bike trails and horse riding tracks through about 1000ha of open forest and melaleuca wetlands. This family-friendly, outdoor recreational destination has a covered barbecue area, picnic tables, seating, bike wash

down area, horse and bike stations, toilets, and access to power and water. The main entry is at 487-503 German Church Road, Redland Bay.

Alternatively, take a leisurely stroll along the expansive beaches of North Stradbroke Island (see pages 20-37) then refresh or refuel at Point Lookout's popular eateries, located opposite one of Australia's most stunning boardwalks.

As the world's second largest sand island, North Stradbroke Island (Minjerribah) offers a unique island getaway for all ages and budgets. It has been the home of the Quandamooka People for more than 21,000 years.

Ideal for day trips, weekend visits and longer stays, 'Straddie' (as locals like to call it) has a range of accommodation options, from camping and glamping to luxury holiday homes, eco tents, beachside cabins, hotel, hostel, B&B, family-friendly resorts and more.

An exciting range of adventures and discoveries awaits you among the white sand beaches, crystal clear ocean waters and natural, freshwater creeks and lakes. Experience whale watching, 4WD, sand boarding, surfing, diving and snorkelling in some of the world's best dive sites, golf, cultural activities and so much more.



HOW TO GET HERE

Passenger and vehicle ferries regularly depart Toondah Harbour, Emmet Drive, Cleveland for Dunwich, North Stradbroke Island. The passenger ferry is a 20 minute trip, with a choice of two operators. The vehicle ferry is about a 45 minute trip.

You can travel around the island in your own or hired vehicle, bus or scooter. The island also offers a cab service.



Ferries - Stradbroke Ferries and Gold Cats Stradbroke Flyer

Car - The island townships of Dunwich, Amity Point and Point Lookout are connected by sealed roads. Check with hire car companies whether their vehicles are permitted on the island. 4WD permits are required for off-road and beach adventures and are available from Minjerribah Camping.

Bus - Stradbroke Island Buses connect with ferries to the island. Buses also operate from Dunwich ferry terminal and One Mile Jetty for transfers to and from Point Lookout and Amity Point.

Shuttle Bus - A private shuttle bus service is available through bookings with StradEasy.

Stradbroke Cab Service - Two maxi taxis on the island can transport up to 10 passengers each.

Scooters - Scooter hire is available from Scooters on Straddie.

SeaLink Stradbroke Ferries operates both vehicle and passenger ferries to North Stradbroke Island. The Departure Lounge Café at our Cleveland terminal serves delicious food and coffee in our famous 'I love Straddie cups'. Our vehicle ferries have a licenced café for added comfort. Passenger tickets can be purchased online for our fast passenger ferry with free, on board WiFi.

We operate a minimum 20 services per day across our vehicle and passenger ferries and we are open seven days a week, 365 days a year. Advanced vehicle ferry bookings are highly recommended.



Dunwich

(Goompi)

A trip to 'Straddie' by passenger ferry lands you at Dunwich – a small, relaxed and friendly township steeped in history and culture. Follow the heritage trail and visit the sites of a former leper colony, Dunwich Benevolent Asylum and old military sites.

North Stradbroke Island Historical Museum is a particular highlight, documenting the island's social history from Aboriginal traditions to early colonial history, shipwrecks, the sand mining story and more.

Enjoy a round of golf with the local kangaroos, go swimming at the nearby Brown Lake, make the trek to Blue Lake and then relax at the Little Ship Club over a drink and meal.

Discover the pristine Myora Springs – a place of cultural significance and home to a variety of native wildlife; or delight in the Aboriginal artwork at island art galleries and studios.

Dunwich is the island's main service centre and offers waterfront camping grounds and other accommodation options.





Amity Point (Pulan)

A relaxed fishing village dotted with seaside holiday houses and colourful cabins. There is a camping ground, swimming enclosure, general store, café and seafood house located only minutes away from the popular jetty where the local trawlers moor. Koalas are often spotted in the township's trees, so be sure to keep an eye out for them when taking a leisurely stroll. Of an evening, as the sun sets over the ocean, and the dolphins play, feel yourself truly engage in holiday mode.



Point Lookout (Mooloomba)

As the main tourist hub of North Stradbroke Island, Point Lookout is home to some of the best surf beaches in Australia. Kangaroos are often spotted grazing on the rocky outcrops opposite the boutique stores and cafés that line the headland. The beginning of the iconic Gorge Walk is located only metres away, providing breathtaking views across the Pacific Ocean, while South Gorge, in all its rugged beauty, is a sight not to be missed.

Surfing legend

BEDE DURBIDGE'S GUIDE TO SURFING

Why is Straddie a surfers' heaven?

The formation of the rocks and the way the island faces means it has ideal surfing conditions from different wind directions and picks up more swell than many other areas of the eastern coast of Australia.

What is your first tip for anyone surfing Straddie?

Check the wind conditions and how big the swell is forecast to be; and head to the beach with the right conditions.

A couple of tips for beginners?

Give North Stradbroke Island Surf School a call for a great introduction to surfing. If you are going to have a go yourself, start at the safer breaks of Cylinder Beach or Adder Rock.
